

# Oregon Lass Enters Beauty Contest

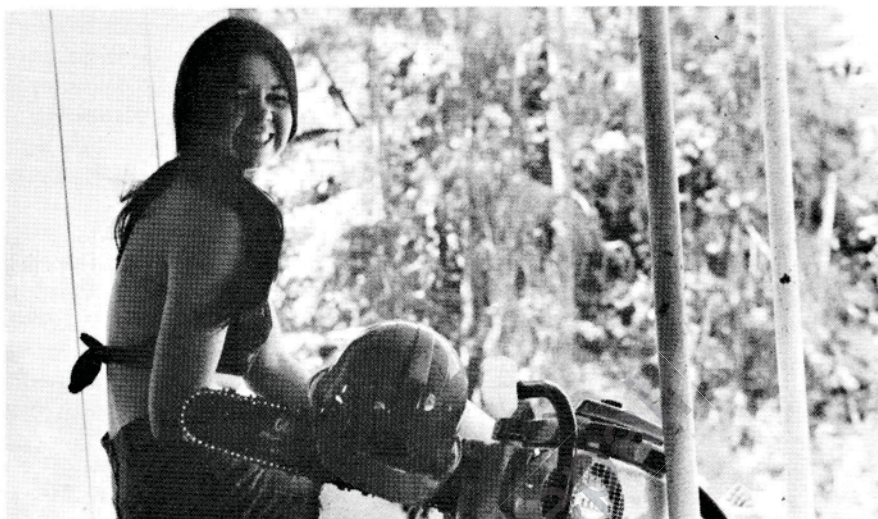
Another comely candidate has added her qualifications to the roster of entries in *Chain Saw Age's* "Miss Chain Saw 1974-75" contest.

## Homelite Moves Portland Branch

Homelite, a division of Textron, Inc., one of the largest manufacturers of chain saws, moved its Portland, Oregon branch facility in November to the Greenburg Space Center, a new industrial park on Greenburg Road in Washington county some 30 miles from Portland.

Value of the 15,000 square foot lease is in excess of \$360,000.

Charles Ridenhour, district manager for Homelite, reported that the search for new quarters took more than two years, but "We're pleased to have located space that is so suitable for our warehousing, service center, and office needs," he said.

Headquartered in Port Chester, New York, Homelite has 36 branch outlets throughout the country serving more than 9,000 dealers. The Portland facility serves Oregon, Idaho and southwest Washington.
